Cowley's holds benefit for MI-COPS

Cowley & Sons Pub will today (Sunday, Feb. 22) host its second fund-raiser to benefit MI-COPS, a statewide non-profit organization committed to assisting the families of police officers killed in the line of duty.

Last year Greg Cowley, a co-owner, hosted a similar event for MI-COPS which raised \$5,000. It ushered in the opening of the completely new pub which was torn to the ground and rebuilt. It's been a family-owned landmark for years.

"We opened the new building March 12 with the Black Tie Charity event," said Greg Cowley, a co-owner of Cowley & Sons on Grand River. "This is a statewide organization that raises money for the families of fallen police officers in Michigan. We have friends and customers that see this as a very worthy cause and we have committed to do fund-raising annually. Given the recent tragedy in Detroit this week, we hope to generate many donations and attendance to the planned function at John Cowley & Sons."
